despertado al bebé.

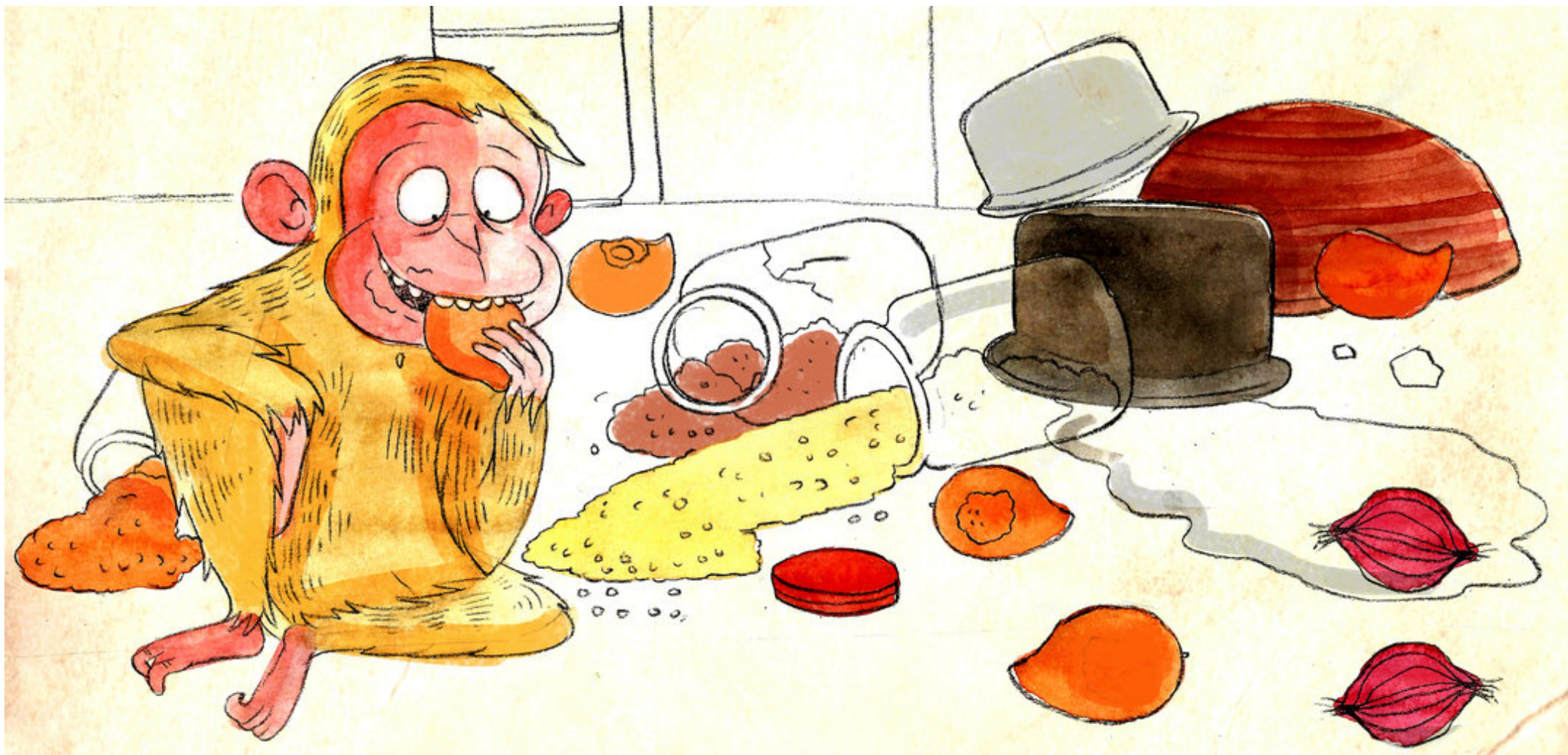




Si no hubiera despertado al bebé,

el mono no habría entrado.

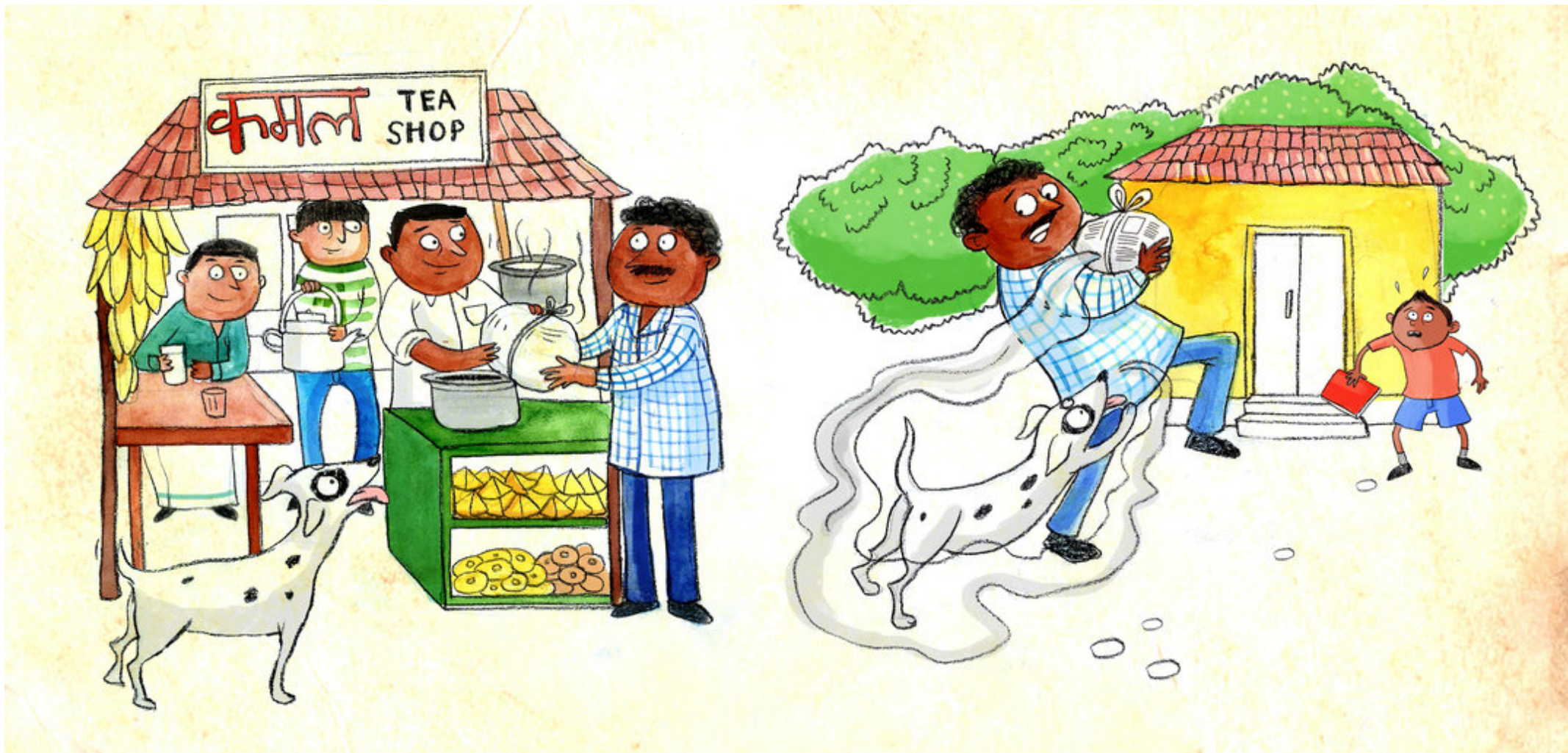




Si el mono no hubiera entrado,  
no se habría comido toda la comida.

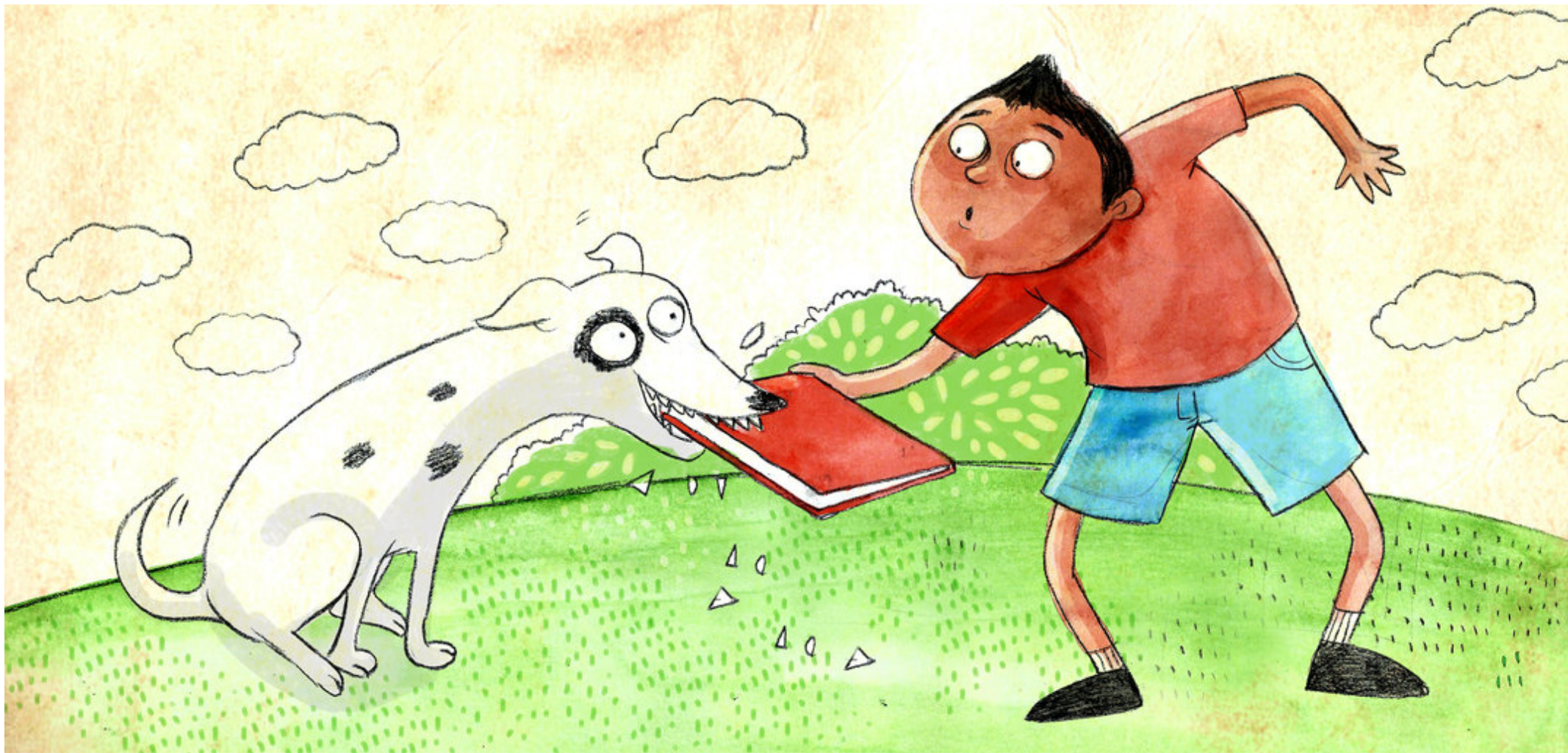
Si no se hubiera comido toda la comida,

Si señorita, es todo culpa del gato!



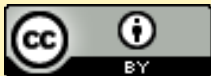
