







Pero ella dijo a todos en la escuela que sí lo tenía.




"El nombre de mi perrito es Shankar" le dijo a Venu


"Shankar come bananas" le dijo a Abdul

muchas personas" dijo Ammu.


"Entonces jugaremos con él


